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

### ADDRESSING PROBLEMS

Below are the top three consistent issues; how to avoid and how to correct:

#### • Problem: Long line at the Visitor Lane

Solution: 1) Ensure your primary phone number is up to date; 2) add your guest to your visitor log prior to arrival, reduces 50% of the interaction time by eliminating the need for gate authorization with a phone call; and 3) visitor has proper state issued identification readily available.

### • Problem: Not presenting proper state issued identification

Solution: Have identification ready! It's nearly impossible for SO's to remember over 940+ resident profiles! Identification is vital for address verification, correct name spelling and deny entry individuals.

#### • Problem: Contractors/Vendors not allowed entry at certain times

Solution: Per the Post Orders set forth in CDD policy-REMEMBER these authorized work hours and schedule accordingly: Mon-Fri, 7am-7pm; Sat & Sun, 9am-7pm. Holidays, 9am-7pm. ALL work vehicles must leave by 8pm everyday. (For emergencies, i.e. plumber, a/c, internet/phone; contact the gate house and let them know of the emergency so they can properly notate in their report log)

### WATER SAFETY BASICS

Supervision is rule #1. Kids must be watched whenever they're around water. This is true whether the water is in a bathtub, a wading pool,



an ornamental fish pond, a swimming pool, a spa, an ocean, or a lake.

Young children are especially at risk. They can drown in less than 2 inches (6 centimeters) of water. That means drowning can happen in a sink, toilet bowl, fountains, buckets, inflatable pools, or small bodies of standing water around your home, such as ditches filled with rainwater. Always watch children closely when they are in or near any water, no matter what their swimming skills. Even kids who know how to swim can be at risk for drowning. For instance, a child could slip and fall on the pool deck, lose consciousness, and fall into the pool and possibly

Young kids and weak swimmers should have an adult swimmer within arm's reach to provide "touch supervision."

Swimming lessons. Swimming lessons are an important part of water safety. Kids can start taking them at age 1. Younger kids often begin with water survival skills training (like learning how to roll onto their back and float). Along with swimming lessons, this training can reduce the risk of drowning in kids ages 1-4. Kids and parents often can take these classes together. Check local recreation centers for classes taught by a qualified instructor. If you do not know how to swim, consider taking lessons.

# Florida's Homeowner's Insurance Crisis

If you own a home in Florida, you may be aware that homeowner's insurance is getting trickier and more costly this year. Some policies are even being canceled, coming as a surprise to many. It sounds crazy but unfortunately, it's true!

For example, Progressive Insurance recently gave 56,000 Florida homeowners notice that their homeowner's insurance will not be renewed if their roof is over 15 years old. Homeowner's insurance is causing headaches for new home buyers and existing customers alike - and it's nearing a crisis. In some areas, entire zip codes are being canceled by insurance companies. If you are wondering what might bring the real estate market to a halt, this could be it.

A major driver in this crisis is excess litigation in the Sunshine state. A whopping 76% of the lawsuits filed in the United States against insurance providers were filed in Florida.

The insurance industry lost \$1.6 billion in 2020. That translates to higher rates for Floridians. Companies are dropping policies altogether, limiting the types and ages of homes they'll cover, increasing rates, and just flat out going out of business.

Much of this stems from an excess of roof replacement claims over the past few years. If you live in Florida, this comes as no surprise. As a result, there are currently only about 10 insurance companies in the state where there used to



be over 50.

Premiums, if coverage is continued, are skyrocketing between 30 - 40% - with some in the northern part of the state reporting theirs are doubling. This all trickles down to the housing mar-ket, especially in the case of affordability.

Another alarming issue is that the more private insurers are squeezed out, the more home-owners are left with only one choice: Citizens Property Insurance. Citizens is a non-profit,


tax-exempt, government entity. That being said, if a massive hurricane wipes out a large number of their insured properties and they don't have enough surplus to cover the loss, all Floridians will be assessed to cover the difference. Currently, Citizens is estimated to be writing 5,000 policies a week and they expect to surpass the 1 million policy mark in 2022. It is in our best interest as Flo-ridians to see more private insurers return to our market and grow.

It's a mess, but there is hope. Legislation is being proposed that will give insurance companies flexibility on what they offer, amongst other things, with Senate Bill 1728 and House Bill 1307. This could potentially help create stabilization, making insurance affordable again and helping to bring back our badly needed private insurers.


